### **Holy Gospel**

**John 20: 1-18**

*All stand.*

*Celebrant*      The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John.  
*People*          **Glory to you, Lord Christ.**

Early on the first day of the week, while it was still dark, Mary Magdalene came to the tomb and saw that the stone had been removed from the tomb. So she ran and went to Simon Peter and the other disciple, the one whom Jesus loved, and said to them, "They have taken the Lord out of the tomb, and we do not know where they have laid him." Then Peter and the other disciple set out and went toward the tomb. The two were running together,

but the other disciple outran Peter and reached the tomb first. He bent down to look in and saw the linen wrappings lying there, but he did not go in. Then Simon Peter came, following him, and went into the tomb. He saw the linen wrappings lying there, and the cloth that had been on Jesus' head, not lying with the linen wrappings but rolled up in a place by itself. Then the other disciple, who reached the tomb first, also went in, and he saw and believed; for as yet they did not understand the scripture, that he must rise from the dead. Then the disciples returned to their homes.

But Mary stood weeping outside the tomb. As she wept, she bent over to look into the tomb; and she saw two angels in white, sitting where the body of Jesus had been lying, one at the head and the other at the feet. They said to her, "Woman, why are you weeping?" She said to them, "They have taken away my Lord, and I do not know where they have laid him." When she had said this, she turned around and saw Jesus standing there, but she did not know that it was Jesus. Jesus said to her, "Woman, why are you weeping? Whom are you looking for?" Supposing him to be the gardener, she said to him, "Sir, if you have carried him away, tell me where you have laid him, and I will take him away." Jesus said to her, "Mary!" She turned and said to him in Hebrew, "Rabbouni!" (which means Teacher). Jesus said to her, "Do not hold on to me, because I have not yet ascended to the Father. But go to my brothers and say to them, 'I am ascending to my Father and your Father, to my God and your God.'" Mary Magdalene went and announced to the disciples, "I have seen the Lord"; and she told them that he had said these things to her.

**Presentation and Examination of the Candidate**

*Celebrant*

The Candidate for Holy Baptism will now be presented.

*Sponsor*

I present Miguel De Jesus to receive the Sacrament of Baptism.

*The Celebrant asks the candidate*

Do you desire to be baptized?

*Candidate*

I do.

*Then the Celebrant asks the following questions of the candidates who can speak for themselves and of the parents and godparents who speak on behalf of the infant*

*Question* Do you renounce Satan and all the spiritual forces of wickedness that rebel against God?

*Answer* I renounce them.

*Question* Do you renounce the evil powers of this world which corrupt and destroy the creatures of God?

*Answer* I renounce them.

*Question* Do you renounce all sinful desires that draw you from the love of God?

*Answer* I renounce them.

*Question* Do you turn to Jesus Christ and accept him as your Savior?

*Answer* I do.

*Question* Do you put your whole trust in his grace and love?

*Answer* I do.

*After all have been presented, the Celebrant addresses the congregation, saying*

Will you who witness these vows do all in your power to support this person in his life in Christ?

*People* **We will.**

*The Celebrant then says these or similar words*

Let us join with Miguel De Jesus and renew our own baptismal covenant.

*The people gather at the Baptismal font.*

## **The Baptismal Covenant**

*Celebrant* Do you believe in God the Father?

*People* **I believe in God, the Father almighty,  
creator of heaven and earth.**

*Celebrant* Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

*People* **I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord.  
He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit  
and born of the Virgin Mary.  
He suffered under Pontius Pilate,  
was crucified, died, and was buried.  
He descended to the dead.  
On the third day he rose again.  
He ascended into heaven,  
and is seated at the right hand of the Father.  
He will come again to judge the living and the dead.**

*Celebrant* Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

*People* **I believe in the Holy Spirit,  
the holy catholic Church,  
the communion of saints,  
the forgiveness of sins,  
the resurrection of the body,  
and the life everlasting.**

*Celebrant* Will you continue in the apostles' teaching and  
fellowship, in the breaking of bread, and in the prayers ?

*People* **I will, with God's help.**

*Celebrant* Will you persevere in resisting evil, and, whenever  
you fall into sin, repent and return to the Lord?

*People* **I will, with God's help.**

*Celebrant* Will you proclaim by word and example the Good  
News of God in Christ?

*People*     **I will, with God's help.**

*Celebrant* Will you seek and serve Christ in all persons, loving  
                  your neighbor as yourself?

*People*     **I will, with God's help.**

*Celebrant* Will you strive for justice and peace among all  
                  people, and respect the dignity of every human  
                  being?

*People*     **I will, with God's help.**

### **Prayers for the Candidate**

*The Celebrant then says to the congregation*

Let us now pray for Miguel De Jesus who is to receive the Sacrament of  
new birth.

*A Person appointed leads the following petitions*

*Leader* Deliver him, O Lord, from the way of sin and death.

*People*     **Lord, hear our prayer.**

*Leader* Open his heart to your grace and truth.

*People*     **Lord, hear our prayer.**

*Leader* Fill him with your holy and life-giving Spirit.

*People*     **Lord, hear our prayer.**

*Leader* Keep him in the faith and communion of your holy Church.

*People*     **Lord, hear our prayer.**

*Leader* Teach him to love others in the power of the Spirit.

*People*     **Lord, hear our prayer.**

*Leader* Send him into the world in witness to your love.

*People*     **Lord, hear our prayer.**

*Leader* Bring him to the fullness of your peace and glory.

*People*     **Lord, hear our prayer.**

*The Celebrant says*

Grant, O Lord, that all who are baptized into the death of Jesus Christ your  
Son may live in the power of his resurrection and look for him to come  
again in glory; who lives and reigns now and for ever. *Amen.*



## Thanksgiving over the Water

*The Celebrant then says*

The Lord be with you.

*People*           **And also with you.**

*Celebrant*       Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

*People*           **It is right to give him thanks and praise.**

*Celebrant*

We thank you, Almighty God, for the gift of water. Over it the Holy Spirit moved in the beginning of creation. Through it you led the children of Israel out of their bondage in Egypt into the land of promise. In it your Son Jesus received the baptism of John and was anointed by the Holy Spirit as the Messiah, the Christ, to lead us, through his death and resurrection, from the bondage of sin into everlasting life.

We thank you, Father, for the water of Baptism. In it we are buried with Christ in his death. By it we share in his resurrection. Through it we are reborn by the Holy Spirit. Therefore in joyful obedience to your Son, we bring into his fellowship those who come to him in faith, baptizing them in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

*At the following words, the Celebrant touches the water*

Now sanctify this water, we pray you, by the power of your Holy Spirit, that those who here are cleansed from sin and born again may continue for ever in the risen life of Jesus Christ our Savior.

To him, to you, and to the Holy Spirit, be all honor and glory, now and for ever. *Amen.*

## The Baptism

*The candidate is presented to the Celebrant, who then immerses, or pours water upon, the candidate, saying*

Miguel De Jesus, I baptize you in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. *Amen.*

*When this action has been completed for the candidate, the Celebrant at a place in full sight of the congregation, prays over them, saying*

Let us pray.

Heavenly Father, we thank you that by water and the Holy Spirit you have bestowed upon this your servant the forgiveness of sin, and have raised him to the new life of grace. Sustain him, O Lord, in your Holy Spirit. Give him an inquiring and discerning heart, the courage to will and to persevere, a spirit to know and to love you, and the gift of joy and wonder in all your works. *Amen.*

*Then the Celebrant places a hand on the person's head, marking on the forehead the sign of the cross [using Chrism if desired] and saying to each one*

Miguel De Jesus you are sealed by the Holy Spirit and marked as Christ's own for ever. *Amen.*

*When all have been baptized, the Celebrant says*

Let us welcome the newly baptized.

*Celebrant and People*

**We receive you into the household of God. Confess the faith of Christ crucified, proclaim his resurrection, and share with us in his eternal priesthood.**

**Prayers of the People**

*Celebrant:*

Let us pray for the Church and for the world.

*Reader:* For Megan our Bishop, for Reverend John our priest, for Reverend Kevin, and for all the faithful who serve in spirit of your Resurrection, let us pray:

*People:* **Alleluia, Alleluia, We pray to the Risen Lord**

*Reader:* For our President, for all the members of Congress, for our Governor and all those in power, that they might be guided by the spirit of your sacrifice to serve your people without thought of gain and without discrimination, let us pray:

*People: Alleluia, Alleluia, We pray to the Risen Lord*

*Reader:* For the Christians in the Holy Land, that they may remain safe and their faith remain strong. We pray that the sites where Jesus was born, lived, and died may remain accessible to all people.

*People: Alleluia, Alleluia, We pray to the Risen Lord*

*Reader:* For the good earth which God has given us, and for the wisdom and ability to conserve it and for the willingness to share the abundance of her harvest among all your people so that no one will hunger, let us pray:

*People: Alleluia, Alleluia, We pray to the Risen Lord*

*Reader:* For the farmers and those who feed the hungry, for the firefighters and the peace officers, for the military and the peacekeepers. For those on our prayers list [*Insert prayer list here*] Let us pray:

*People: Alleluia, Alleluia, We pray to the Risen Lord*

*Reader:* For the poor, the unemployed, for prisoners and refugees and those who suffer any kind of oppression, and for all who remember and care for them, let us pray. For those who are elderly and alone, for those who are affected by illness or despair and for those who have lost contact with you, let us pray:

*People: Alleluia, Alleluia, We pray to the Risen Lord*

*Reader:* For the children to be, that they may be well as they wait to be born. For the newborns and newly baptized that they may flourish under the care of parents who love them as you have loved us and for the children, the tweens and the teens, that your Spirit will guide them in lives of active faith, let us pray:

*People: Alleluia, Alleluia, We pray to the Risen Lord*

*Reader:* For those who have recently departed this life, that they may be safe in your arms. For those who lost loved ones, that their loss and pain will be lessened as they remember the promise of your Resurrection, let us pray:

*People: Alleluia, Alleluia, We pray to the Risen Lord*

*The Celebrant adds a concluding Collect.*

Almighty God, we entrust all who are dear to us to thy never-failing care and love, for this life and the life to come, knowing that thou art doing for them better things than we can desire or pray for; through Christ our Lord.  
*Amen.*

*All remain standing.*

Holy and gracious Father: In your infinite love you made us for yourself, and, when we had fallen into sin and become subject to evil and death, you, in your mercy, sent Jesus Christ, your only and eternal Son, to share our human nature, to live and die as one of us, to reconcile us to you, the God and Father of all.

Therefore we proclaim the mystery of faith:

We celebrate the memorial of our redemption, O Father, in this sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving. Recalling his death, resurrection, and ascension, we offer you these gifts.

Sanctify them by your Holy Spirit to be for your people the Body and Blood of your Son, the holy food and drink of new and unending life in him. Sanctify us also that we may faithfully receive this holy Sacrament, and serve you in unity, constancy, and peace; and at the last day bring us with all your saints into the joy of your eternal kingdom.

All this we ask through your Son Jesus Christ: By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and for ever. *AMEN.*

And now, as our Savior Christ has taught us, we are bold to say:
